Dear Families.

Welcome to the 'Learning Pit' - Welcome back to term 2; a start to a term like no other. James Nottingham is an educator and the brains behind the creation of the 'Learning Pit' . The 'Learning Pit' supports a culture of challenge, curiosity, reflection and resilience in our children.

The 'Learning Pit' is often referred to in our classrooms. It is a place that teachers and parents intentionally place their learners so that they can learn. We have all been in 'the pit' in the last couple of weeks at one stage or another. Think of the strategies you have used to solve a problem to do with accessing the online learning. They have probably included:


- → Searching for a solution online;
- → Contacting a fellow parent;
- → Contacting the school; or;
- ightarrow Simply 'guessing and checking' another perfectly suitable strategy for solving a problem.

How do you feel when you've persevered and managed to solve the problem? Relieved? Triumphant? Do you think you could solve this problem on your own next time? If the only strategy we had was 'get someone else to do it', we wouldn't be challenged and wouldn't learn anything.

As teachers, we were thrown head first into 'the pit' at the end of last term. Few of us had worked with the software or the applications we are currently using. After some professional learning and MANY mistakes, we are now discussing how this technology can be used better in our day to day teaching to further advance the learning of your children—success! What a dedicated and resilient group of teachers we have here at St Patrick's.

The bottom line is that challenge is good for learning. These few weeks at home are a great opportunity to challenge our children with different learning experiences. Give

your child a recipe and let them go! By nature, they will start asking you questions because they won't want to make a mistake. Tell them that you'll be back in the kitchen in 20minutes and they can ask the questions that need answering then. They'll make mistakes and will have to persevere but ultimately they will learn things that they did not know before. I've heard of one student learning to weld and another moving hay bales in the tractor; much can be learned from challenging our children.
